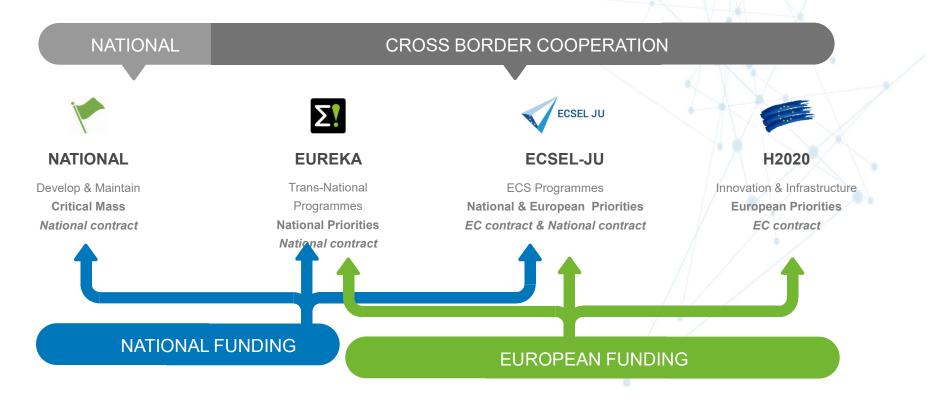

SME's major role

- SME's essential pillar of European innovationdriven growth
 - EU SME's: 67% FTE, 57% Gross Value
 - Disruptive innovation coming with new players
- 🧶 But...
 - Harder for SME's than for large corporations to into ECS "Community"
 - SME's participation into the EC, ECSEL and instruments lower than GVA share
- Need to adjust existing support mechanisms to Engagement with collaborative funding

Statistically sound data on SME's

- 🧶 Purpose
 - Inform funding instruments and SME ecosystems as to best way of providing open access to SME's in advanced (trans-national) RDSI cooperation
 - Ultimate goal : Support rapid commercialisation and high levels of economic and societal benefits to Europe.
- 🖉 Survey building principles
 - Differentiate between experienced and new SME's (with regards to collaborative R&I projects)
 - Determine "WHY" SME's participate/wish to participate in such collaboration
 - Understand "HOW" SME's participate/wish to participate in such collaboration
 - Determine "BARRIERS" that may prevent effective SME involvement

needs

- Gather sufficient organisational data to enable analysis into segments of interest
- No more than 10 minutes to complete
- 🥲 Time line
 - Survey launched before mid-March, open for 3 weeks
 - Distributed via the contributing ecosystems
 - Data analysis / Common recommendation elaboration by AENEAS SME Engagement Council in April
 - Recommendations approved by stakeholders and submitted to funding instruments end May / beg. June
 - In time for consideration into 2019 Calls
